Massachusetts passed SB 2400 in 2012, which requires the MA Division of Insurance and Board of Registration in Medicine to review out-of-state physician issues and develop recommendations for legislation to permit use of out-of-state physicians for telemedicine.

<b>Definition of telemedicine/telehealth</b>	
<p>“Telemedicine as it pertains to the delivery of health care services, shall mean the use of interactive audio, video or other electronic media for the purpose of diagnosis, consultation or treatment. ‘Telemedicine’ shall not include the use of audio-only telephone, facsimile machine or e-mail.”</p> <p><i>Source: Annotated Laws of MA.
